MAKERS MANUAL #50 Esmée Dros



INTRODUCTION

In this manual you will learn a technique called: cyanotype. It's a very fun and easy technique where you can photograph patterns in fabric or paper. With this manual you are going to make kitchen towels. You can use anything from your kitchen or home to make any pattern you like!

For one towel I used round lids, for the other dried pepper, lemon, and Peruvian groundcherry. In the end you will have a homemade funky blue-white patterned kitchen towel.

LIST OF THINGS

MATERIALS

- The cyanotype Jacquard A+B Component kit

TOOLS

- Old kitchen towel (white/ light fabric)
- Mixing bowl
- Table spoon
- Bucket with water
- Brush (not necessarily required)Natural daylight (the sunnier the better)
- Anything you want to make a pattern with: cutlery, fresh herbs, popcorn, fruit, bottles, etc.
- A flat tray or cardboard to move the towel from inside to outside

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STEP 1

Before you start your project, make sure that you have the right materials. For this project I used the Jacquard A+B Component. Each bottle has pre-made powder in it. Fill the bottles with water, and shake them. For the best results, do this a day before and let it rest for 24 hours.



STEP 2 Before soak

Before soaking your towel in the cyanotype component, make a lay-out of how you want your pattern to look like. When the A+B components are mixed, the uv process






Quickly stir and and put the towel in the emulsion. You can soak your towel completely or use a brush if you only want parts of it to be covered.

STEP 4




STEP 5

When your pattern is ready, go outside with your tray and let the sun do its magic. You will see pretty quickly that the green fabric starts getting darker and darker. Exposure time depends on how sunny it is. The



STEP 6 When the towel is dark blue, it's time to go back inside. Remove your objects and put your towel in a bucket of water. Make sure all the emulsion is out by washing it. Refresh the water 2-3 times to be completely sure.




BIO OF THE DESIGNER


FURTHER READING



STEP 3 Then you mix the A+B components 50/50 in your mixbowl. I used 3 tablespoons of each for 1 towel. When your towel is covered with the green emulsion, lay it out on your tray and start putting your sketch on there. Do this as quick as possible.



sunnier the shorter, but I would say between 5 to 20 minutes.



STEP 7

Let your towel dry and voila! Now you have your selfmade cyano-towel. These towels are also laundry proof, so wash them once before you use them in the kitchen.
